
He is fully engaged and always prepared no matter the event. .


NIGERIAN INTERNATIONAL PETROLEUM SUMMIT

After the well-attended African local content roundtable held in Yoanega on June 3, the Ministry of Petroleum Resources continued its efforts with another high-profile event three days later. On June 6, the government officials from the department welcomed the different delegations who were attending to the Nigerian International Petroleum Summit for talks.

On day two, which took place at the villa, keynote speeches were given by the Minister of State Petroleum Resources Timipre Sylva representing President Buhari. Several important personalities were also present, led by the President of Senate, Ahmad Ibrahim Lawan. In their opening statements, each political luminary congratulated the Ministry of Petroleum Resources for successfully organizing the summit in this difficult time, given the limitations and constraints on the proceedings because of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

For the opening ceremony and numerous panels, the international community sent delegations or attended virtually. The multinational firms in the oil and gas industry were very well represented. It was a much-anticipated occasion for the private, public sectors and diplomatic representation to mingle and share their thoughts.

Many subjects were discussed during opening day of the conference; however, a few important points needed to be particularly stressed. The Ministry of Petroleum Resources stated that the objective of Nigeria was to raise production to four million barrels a day and promote gas as a viable alternative to oil. Nigeria's delegate laid out an ambitious plan to build a massive gas pipeline which will go all the way to Morocco. A few problems were also mentioned, starting with the difficulty of raising funds because global financial institutions are trying to be politically correct and allying with the new world trend consisting in making oil obsolete, citing climate change. This so-called, new world reality is promoting other sources of energy, such as bio-fuels, wind and solar energy. Though Africa is emerging as an important player in the global energy industry, important decisions are taken by the west, but Africa is not even adequately involved in the decision process, even though the continent has more than a 100 million barrels of oil reserve, not even factoring in newdiscoveries.



One of the main conclusions of the summit was that it was high time for African nations to open a frank and strategic discussion concerning the future of energy sources.

The representatives of NNPC, APPO, GECF, IEF, OPEC, and from all the other countries present, pleaded for a uniformization of the strategy. African countries should closely collaborate, based uniquely on the continent realities and interest. The second day ended with a gala dinner where the those who have made notable contributions to the African petroleum industry were rewarded. On the third and the fourth day of the summit, the ICC hosted an expo of key players and several panels were on the schedule, featuring such speakers as Andrew Nevin Charlotte Essiet and others.

A special interest was put on the role of technology within the industry. Participants stressed the importance new technology will play in the discovery and exploitation of oil and gas. It is evident that technology will impact the chain going from Research and Development to employment. The main challenge centres around using technology in a smart and efficient way. A bridge was made to the newly open Unicorn Technology Campus in Lagos. This could play a very important role if governments synchronize and utilize this one-of-a-kind facility in across Africa.



Another important discussion was open concerning the of development marginal fields allowing deal seekers and decision makers to interact smoothly. At the end of these two long but very productive days, the summit was brought festive a to conclusion at the Tanscorp Hilton with CEOs Gala the Dinner.

Finally on the last day of the summit, an open discussion was made around how to develop marginal fields particularly smaller companies. Plotting the roadmap to gas powered economy to 2030 and beyond. The minister of State Petroleum Resources Chief Timipre Sylva in his final address thanked all the participants for having these franc and open discussions for the future of the oil and gas industry but stressed the fact that we should act and act quickly. At this point the vision is clear, we need actions.



The estimated crude oil reserve in Nigeria is 37 billion barrels and 220 trillion cubic feet of gas reserves.

Nigeria has witnessed an important progression in value addition, going from less than five percent to 35 percent between 2010 and 2021. The goal is to reach 70 percent by 2027 and given Nigeria's trajectory, they are on target to meet that amount. Unfortunately, the reality of Africa's oil producers is a little gloomy as they have not fully benefited from their resources even though Africa accounts for over fifteen oil producers in the continent.



This roundtable meeting was an occasion initiate to conversations on local content, share success stories and come up adapted with policies for each country. Furthermore, it was a forum to allow African oil producers to take the opportunity to advance the process towards free trade in Africa. The 54 countries within the African continent represent a market of 1.2 billion with customers a cumulated growth of over 10.4 trillion dollars.

The minister's advocacy resonated loudly among the participants and posed the crucial issues Africa needs to face and quickly advance for the sake of all Africans. A Pan-African speech that has to be dispatched and acted on now.


